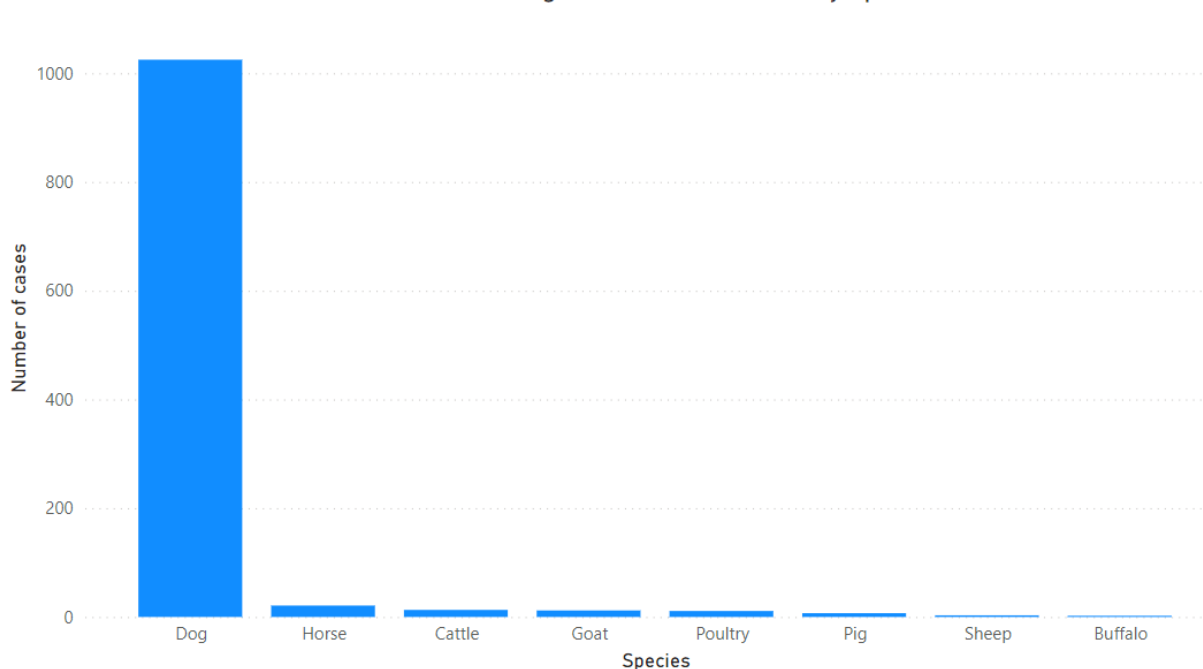
BACKGROUND

2. This report describes the activities undertaken by the NT DITT during the financial year 2021/22.

DISCUSSION

3. There were 1094 NT cases submitted under the NNDI project which is comparative to the previous year, due to the ongoing *E. canis* reporting.

4. The MAX based database was helpful in capturing the large number of submissions over this financial year. Data extraction from the laboratory information management system (LIMS) remains challenging, with a high volume of manual data entry, cross checking and management required.
