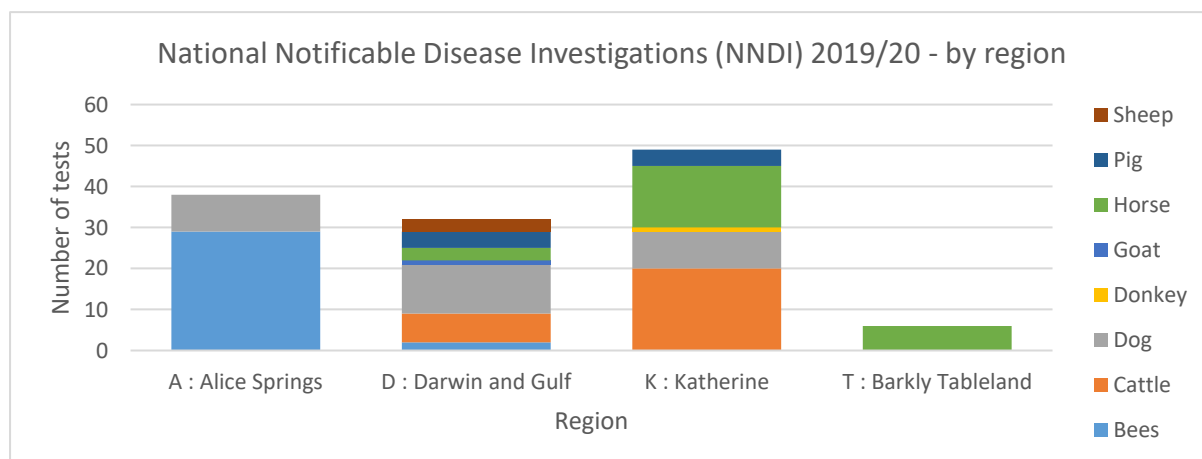
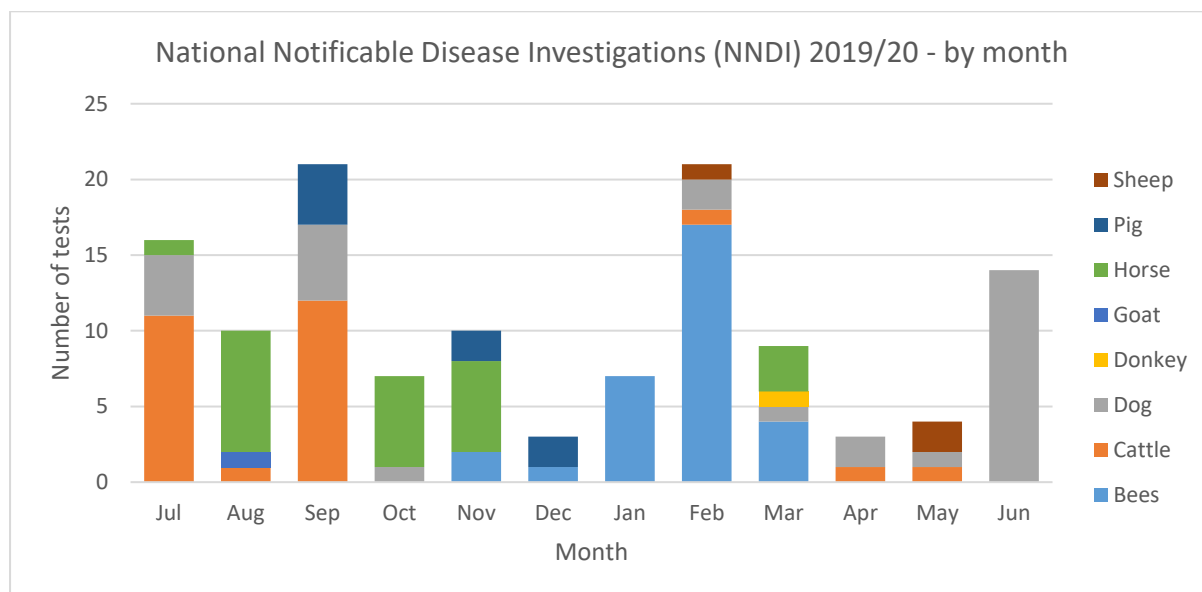

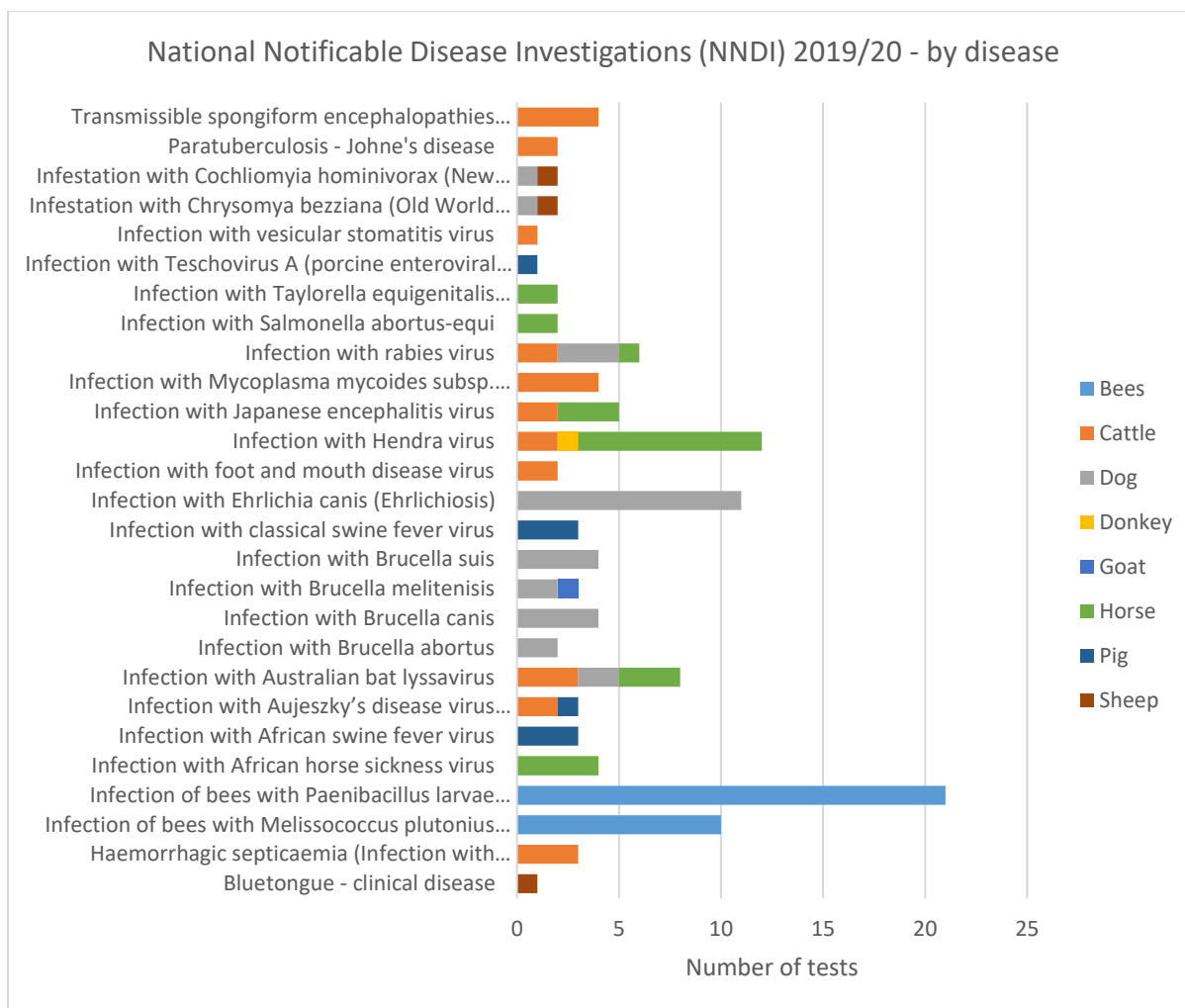
BACKGROUND
